About the LAA TILT Initiative

The Laundry Association of Australia (LAA) is proud to launch TILT - Technology, Innovation and the Laundry of Tomorrow - a dedicated committee focused on positioning the Australian commercial laundry sector at the forefront of technological advancement, operational innovation and industry transformation.

The commercial laundry industry is undergoing a period of rapid change. Automation, artificial intelligence, IoT-connected machinery, water and energy efficiency technologies, and data-driven operations are reshaping how laundries run - and how they compete. The businesses that invest in understanding and adopting these technologies will lead the sector. The TILT Committee exists to ensure that LAA members are at the front of that wave, not chasing it.

Established under the LAA banner, the TILT Committee will drive research, education, advocacy and practical guidance to help Australian laundry businesses - of every size - navigate and benefit from technological change. The Committee will operate as a formal advisory body to the LAA Board, with representation from laundry operators, allied trade and technology suppliers across all states and territories.

Our Vision, Mission & Purpose

VISION

An Australian commercial laundry sector that leads the Asia-Pacific region in technology adoption, operational innovation and sustainable industrial practice.

MISSION

To equip LAA members with the knowledge, tools and networks to confidently adopt emerging technologies and drive innovation across their operations.

PURPOSE

To build a smarter, more competitive and more sustainable laundry industry by connecting the people who use technology with the people who build it.

What the TILT Committee Will Do

The TILT Committee will be the engine room of technology and innovation activity for the LAA. Key programs and initiatives will include:

- Automation & AI Guidance**
 Producing practical guides and case studies on automation, robotics and AI applications in commercial laundry - from tunnel washers to predictive maintenance systems.
- Water & Energy Innovation**
 Identifying and promoting the latest water recycling, heat recovery, ozone laundry and energy-reduction technologies, supporting members to reduce costs and environmental impact.
- IoT & Connected Operations**
 Exploring IoT-enabled machine monitoring, remote diagnostics, linen tracking (RFID/NFC) and digital workflow platforms that improve productivity and asset management.
- Technology Showcases at Conference**
 Hosting a dedicated technology showcase and innovation session at the LAA Conference in 2028, featuring live demonstrations, supplier presentations and member case studies.
- Industry Research & Benchmarking**
 Commissioning and publishing annual benchmarking reports on technology adoption rates, investment priorities and innovation barriers across the Australian commercial laundry sector.
- Supplier & Vendor Intelligence**
 Maintaining a curated register of technology suppliers, software platforms and innovation partners relevant to the laundry sector, available exclusively to LAA members.
- Sustainability & Circular Economy**
 Advising on sustainable laundry practices including textile lifecycle management, chemical reduction, linen loss minimisation and compliance with emerging ESG reporting requirements.
- Advocacy to Government & Regulators**
 Providing the LAA Board with expert input on technology-related policy, including energy efficiency standards, data privacy obligations and government grant programs for industrial innovation.

Committee Structure & Commitment

The LAA TILT Committee will comprise up to 12 members, drawn from across the LAA membership - including laundry operators, technology and equipment suppliers, software developers, sustainability specialists and allied trade professionals from all states and territories of Australia. With Board permission experts outside the sector and LAA membership may be brought in for advisory purposes.

- Current or recent experience in the commercial laundry sector - as an operator, equipment supplier, technology provider, consultant or allied trade professional
- Demonstrated interest in or experience with technology adoption, operational innovation, automation, sustainability or data-driven business improvement
- Ability to translate complex technical topics into practical, accessible guidance for a diverse membership audience
- Willingness to commit to the time requirements of committee membership (approximately 3–5 hours per quarter)
- Experience in any of the following areas is highly valued: engineering and equipment, software and data systems, sustainability and energy management, procurement, research and development, or business transformation
- Emerging professionals and next-generation leaders in the sector are strongly encouraged to apply - fresh perspectives are essential to innovation
